18.1 DESLUDGE PROGRAM TENDER - AWARD OF CONTRACT

Executive Summary

This report enables Council to award the tender for the desludge of septic tanks for a five year period in Pinnaroo and Lameroo and at public facilities in Parilla and Geranium.

Council allocates operational budget annually for this ongoing service.

Council advertised tenders for the desludge of septic tanks for a five year period via the SA Tenders website. A total of four companies submitted tenders. The tenders were evaluated against predetermined tender assessment criteria. The preferred tenderer is Riverland Tank and Drain Cleaners for a contract price of \$77,062.85.

RECOMMENDATION

That Council awards the contract for the Desludge of Septic Tanks (five year program 2021/22 – 2025/26) in Pinnaroo and Lameroo townships and at public facilities in Parilla and Geranium to Riverland Tank and Drain Cleaners for a contract price of \$77,062.85 (ex GST and CPI increases for 2022/23 – 2025/26)

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Background

Council's Strategic Plan, Goal 3 identifies that Council will deliver the services and facilities to meet community needs. One way that council achieves this is via the desludging program for properties connected to the community wastewater management system (CWMS) in Lameroo and Pinnaroo. This program ensures that systems are inspected every five years to ensure that they are

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compliant and operating efficiently. A properly operating CMWS is vital for the health and wellbeing of our communities.

The desludging program occurs in Lameroo and Pinnaroo over a five year period, with each town divided into five sections with a single section in each town being inspected and desludged each year. The public toilets in Geranium and Parilla are also desludged each year.

Council has historically engaged a third party provider to have the desludging activities carried out across the whole CWMS network over the five year period.

This program was reviewed and changes were made to the provider duties and properties identified relative to the previous program to ensure that the service continues to meet Council and community needs.

Context

Council called for tenders via SA Tenders website. The tender period opened on 29 March 2021 and closed 5pm 26 April 2021. Four tenders were submitted and all tenders were deemed to be conforming prior to evaluation by the Property and Development Services team.

Companies that provided a tender were Riverland Tank and Drain Cleaners, Jury's Liquid Waste, Upper South East Liquid Waste Pty Ltd, Loxton Tank and Drain Cleaning.

Tenders were evaluated against the assessment criteria by a panel comprising the Manager Property and Development and both of Council's Property and Development Services Officers. Tender prices provided by each company are all GST exclusive. A bid comparison summary and detailed tender evaluation is provided as an attachment to this report.

Policy and statutory implications

Council has a procurement policy and the tender process has been undertaken in accordance with the policy.

All Council purchases must be carried out in compliance with the Local Government Act 1999 (the Act). Section 49 (a1) of the Act requires Council to develop and maintain procurement policies, practices and procedures directed towards:

- Obtaining value in the expenditure of public money, and
- Providing for ethical and fair treatment of participants, and
- Ensuring probity, accountability and transparency in the procurement process.

Council is not obliged to accept the lowest tender or any tender.

Issues

Riverland Tank and Drain Cleaners provided a clear lowest tender price. The assessment panel had some concerns relating to the potential quality of service deliver for such a low price relative to other tenderers. However other clients of Riverland Tank and Drain Cleaners have confirmed their satisfaction with the company's service.

As noted the contract price excludes GST. The price also excludes consumer price index (CPI) increases for years two to five of the program.

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Alternate options

Council could accept a different tender firm. This is not recommended and if this did occur the reasons for this decision should be documented.

Financial implications

The cost of the septic tank desludge program is provided for as an operational cost in each annual budget.

Work Health and Safety and Risk implications

The submitted tenders included work health and safety components. There are no new risk implications associated with this matter.

Consultation

The tender process was public



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
